2011 BUDGET OVERVIEW

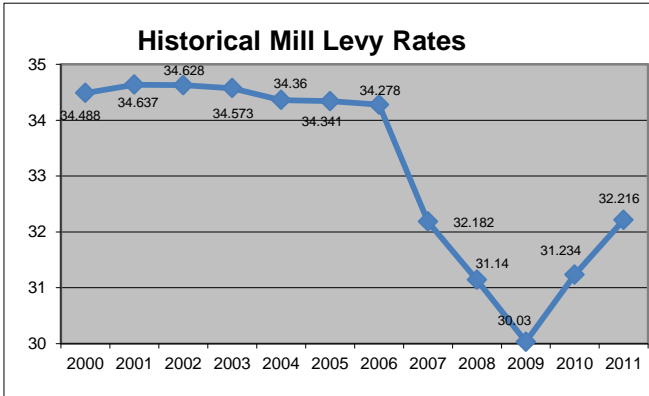


The 2011 Riley County Budget includes:

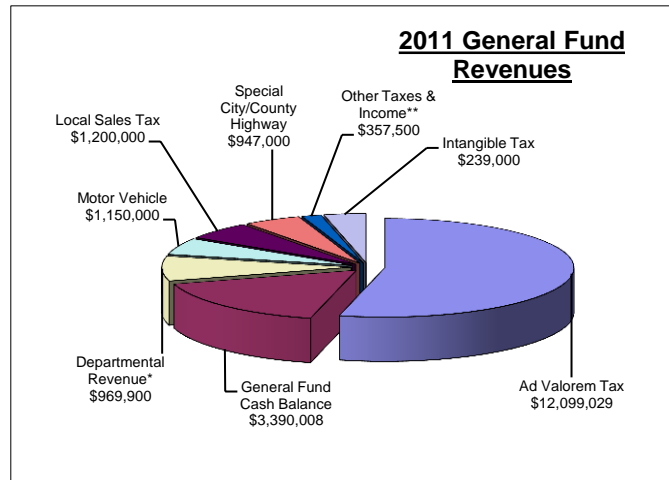
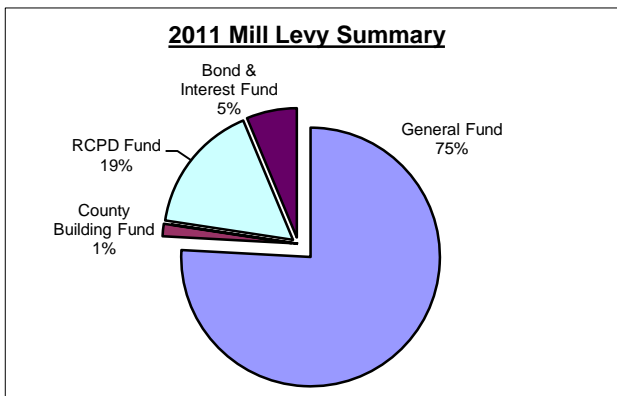
- Less than a 1.0 mil increase in mill levy rate.
- \$1.4 Million** Konza Water project completion.
- Opening of the **\$3.5 million** Law Enforcement Center Jail expansion
- Over **\$3.6 Million** in Road & Bridge Projects from the Voter Approved 1/2 Cent Sales Tax
- \$1.6 Million** in Appropriations to Various Agencies to Provide Crucial Services to the Citizens of Riley County
- \$5.8 Million** in Public Safety Expenditures for EMS, Police, Fire, Emergency Management and 911 Services

RILEY COUNTY MILL LEVY

The chart below depicts historical mill levy rates. Until recently, you will notice the Riley County Board of County Commissioners have either kept the mill levy relatively flat or reduced it. This year, the Riley County Commission increased the mill levy by less than a mil, based on an estimated assessed valuation of: \$500,134,252. This valuation is an increase of only 1.17% over the current actual assessed valuation of: \$493,802,872. Historically, valuations rise by an average of 6 to 8%.

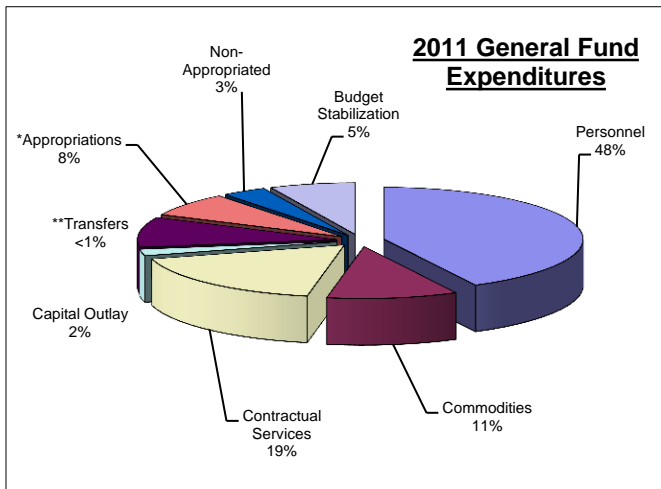


The chart below shows the breakdown of Riley County's Mill Levy, the majority of which is within the General fund. County department's personnel services, commodities, and capital expenditures are budgeted within the General fund along with agency appropriations. The 2011 General Fund expenditures are listed in the far right column. The RCPD fund includes the county's 20% funding requirement as well as inmate medical and facilities costs. Bond & Interest funds the county's debt obligations. The County Building fund pays for all county facilities repair and maintenance costs.



Mortgage Registration Fees, Recording Fees, 21st Judicial District Attorney's Grants, Elections, Noxious Weed, Planning & Development County Fair Income, Emergency Management, and County Clerk Licensing Fees.

**Other Taxes Income: Recreational Vehicle Tax, 16/20 motor vehicle tax, Interest Income, Vehicle Rental Excise tax, Franchise Fees and Interest on tax.
