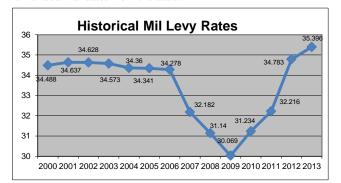

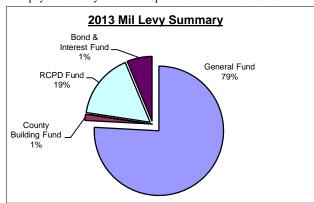

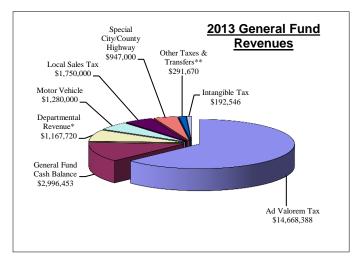
RILEY COUNTY MIL LEVY

The chart below depicts historical mil levy rates. Historically, assessed valuations rise by an average of 6% to 8%. Assessed Valuation for the 2013 budget is 526,848,288, an increase of 3.14% over last year. In the past 3 years, valuations have increased on average by 2.15%. This increase as well as loss of state revenues contribute to the recently increased mil levy rates. Since 2002, Riley County has lost an estimated \$19,842,543 in state revenues due to the elimination of LAVTR, Revenue Sharing, City/County Highway, CIME reimbursement, Business & Machinery elimination & Vehicle Tax plus the impact of unfunded mandates from the state.



The chart below shows the breakdown of Riley County's Mil Levy, the majority of which is within the General fund. County departments' personnel services, commodities and capital expenditures are budgeted within the General fund, along with agency appropriations. The 2013 General Fund budgeted expenditures are listed in the far right column. The RCPD fund includes the county's 20% funding requirement, as well as inmate medical and facilities costs. Bond & Interest funds the county's debt obligations. The County Building fund pays for county facilities' repair and maintenance costs.

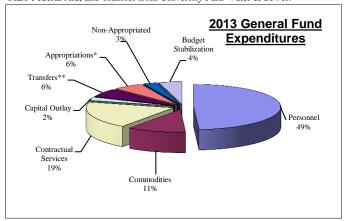
